If that's the case, I'll be back in about an hour and a half!" I donned some rain gear and pulled out of the drive about 8:15 heading for Black Mountain.

I got to Dynamite Roasting about 9:15 and saw one bike that I recognized. An 800 GS belonging to John Koenig. When I went inside I also found Wayne Zell and a couple others that were all in cars. Soon Carl Lail showed up on his R100 GS and just after 10:00 Thomas Montgomery from Eurosport arrived on a shop R1200 GS.

Before we got there we turned north-east on Old Fort Road and went back through the same mountains just a little to the east. With all the rain from the night before there was a fair amount of gravel in some of the turns so it was a tad technical but there were no problems. Before reaching Interstate 40 we made a sharp right turn onto Old Fort/Sugar Hill Road and took that east until it dead-ended and we turned north into Marion and our first break.

Then it was east and north on Hwy 70, Hwy 126 past Lake James and up Hwy 181 until we reached Los Arcoiris Mexican Restaurant in the little town of Pineola just north of the Blue Ridge Parkway. The food was very good and I had the best Chile Relleno I have found in North Carolina. (Sorry, I haven't found a good one in the Asheville area). Tom treated us all to lunch compliments of Eurosport. (Thanks Tom, a delightful and unexpected treat.)

After lunch Tom had to head back so he was going to be taking the Parkway and the rest continued north on Hwy 221, Hwy 105, Hwy 184 and a slight detour off of Hwy 194 just north of Banner Elk.
